
School Age Assistant Manager Anne Varner

These videos were used as teaching tools at the Child Development Resource Center in Santa Cruz.

Stepping away from child development, Mary accepted a position at University of California Extension, Santa Cruz working as a Program Associate in the Behavioral Sciences Program, in addition to codirector for an undergraduate wilderness field studies program, Sierra Institute. Ultimately, Mary gravitated back to primary education when her son became school age. First, teaching art curriculum to grades 1-6, then obtaining a K-12 Substitute Teacher Permit.
